In the short and mid-term, these activities will inform and shape policy choices at EU and national levels, including on implementation. In the long-term, it is expected that these activities will maximise the positive impact of the reforms on European societies, while also benefitting migrants and asylum seekers.

These have environmental, economic and social aspects. On 3-4 October 2024 IWE co-organises a conference on Forests in the EU. The EU Forest Strategy for 2030 sets a vision and concrete actions to improve the quantity and quality of EU forests and strengthen their protection, restoration and resilience. This conference aims at providing scientifically sound arguments and civil society inputs into the negotiation process of legislative steps. On 14-15 November 2024 IWE organises the State Varieties of Capitalism conference where a whole panel will be dedicated to EU-China relations (security, economic issues). These relations are controversial because of technological necessities and de-risking strategy. The question is how the special Hungarian China-friendly policy can modify the attitude and tools of the EU. Another crucial issue is the budget spending, cohesion/convergence among EU member states. IWE and EPC will organise an expert workshop in Budapest discussing these issues. Two more workshops will be organised in Brussels inviting IWE experts on other relevant issues of the EU and the presidency. Apart from the events, two studies will be prepared by IWE experts as discussion/working papers on 1. EU competitiveness regarding the Hungarian presidency proposal on EV strategy 2. Rule of law issues in the EU, focusing also on the Hungary problem.
